# Rally Report 2014

The Club conducted double Rally Trials on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> and Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> November double that of last year's 2 for the Club.

A total entry of 251 was received. Not as many as perhaps I had hoped, but with fees higher than other trials some people didn't enter. Most Clubs have their own grounds and do their own catering where-as we have to hire these, hence more expense, some-one has to pay. It was a manageable number though and we finished in good time. With many people gaining titles on the Saturday they didn't turn up on the Sunday to compete so the morning trial was finished earlier than planned which gave the judges extra time to set up their afternoon courses and then they and the stewards had a long, relaxing lunch.

Although I didn't seek sponsorship this year we were very lucky that Club member and Judge, Kathy Millington donated her judging fees back to the Club. As judges now generally charge \$50 per class this was quite a saving for the Club, thank you very much Kathy. Also one competitor donated one lot of her 1<sup>st</sup> prize money back to the Club, thank you Alexa.

Results will appear in the Newsbeat and are on the Club's website so I will not list them here. Congratulations to the Gundog Club members who did so well at the trials, several titles were gained and many "legs" passed.

Trial Manager was the ever well organised Keith Millington, who is so organised he could take off touring and judging around Australia for the 5 months prior to the trial. He was only an email away ......!

Thanks to all judges, helpers, stewards and SACA Rep, in particular thanks to Lynne Webster without whose assistance I would not manage and to Ruth Johns who helped Lynne in the office, ensuring presentation was on the way within 10 minutes of the completion of the trial - unheard of by other Clubs and favourable comments were received. In fact they had one presentation under way within 7 minutes!



"An effective harness is critical when travelling with a pet as it keeps the animal safe and restrained and avoids the driver being distracted while driving with the animal moving around inside the vehicle," says NRMA Insurance Head of Research, Robert McDonald. "In a collision, an unrestrained pet has the potential to injure the driver and other passengers in the vehicle". It's not just crashes that are cause for concern. - In the back!: Just like kids, pets are safest in the back. A dog in the front can distract the driver, and in a crash, the force of the air bags may fatally injure even large dogs. And never drive with your dog in your lap!
- The right restraint: All restraints are not created equal. Some are not designed to withstand the force of sudden stops or turns. Clipping your usual dog lead to a seat belt won't prevent your dog from being propelled in a crash. - **Keep it cool:** Dogs can rapidly dehydrate and suffer from heat stress during the warmer months, and the inside of cars heat up quickly. Never leave a pet unattended in a car, no matter if the weather is hot or cold.
- **Zen-out zone:** Tailor the length of the journey to your dog's personality and how much he can handle comfortably. If your pet is nervous in the car, try spraying lavender or ADAPTIL, a pheromone which may calm him down and also helps with car sickness. 

# NEW RETRIEVING RULES

## Available on the ANKC website

A summary of the significant changes to the rules that came out of the National RAFT meeting.

In Retrieving Trials, changes have been made to the following clauses; Rule 37, Rule 38, Rule 48, Rule 77, Rule 106, Rule 107, Judges Sheet, I think the most significant changes are :

- The number of points on the score sheet that are allocated to heeling, obedience, steadiness around the pegs has been reduced from 10 to 5. As a consequence, the total points on the score sheet will reduce from 65 to 60.
- A new suffix of Qualifying Restricted Dog (QRD) has been introduced for dogs that successfully complete seven (7) Restricted Stakes. Competitors must maintain their own record (to be signed by the judge on the day of the trial), in the same way as is done for QND and AARD.
- Dogs may remain in Novice or Restricted Stakes until they have had five wins in those stakes (although they are not compelled to do so). They will still be eligible for the titles of NRD and RRD after three (3) wins in Novice and Restricted respectively (as they are now) but may continue to compete at that level until they have had two more wins.
- Stakes up to and including Restricted may be conducted with four bona fide exhibits and two different owners.

## **Canine Cognitive Dysfunction (CCD) Trial**

Published on Tuesday, 09 December 2014 14:08



Canine Cognitive Dysfunction (CCD) is a progressive and ultimately fatal disorder with no proven effective treatment.

The DOGS+CELLS Trial aims to discover whether brain engraftment of 'patient-specific' stem cells derived from a dog's own skin can help treat the dementia-like syndrome, Canine Cognitive Dysfunction. If successful this world-first study will pave the way for similar clinical trials in humans with dementia.

#### WHAT IS CANINE COGNITIVE DYSFUNCTION (CCD)?

**CCD** is a dementia-like syndrome that occurs in approximately 12-14% of older dogs more than 10 years of age.



Typical features include:

- Wall staring (see picture)
- Not recognising owners
- Pacing and circling
- Getting lost
- Incontinence

CCD is a progressive and ultimately fatal disorder with no proven effective treatment. It is devastating to the human-animal bond. CCD also has clinical, epidemiological, pathological and pharmacological similarities to human Alzheimer's dementia. #### DIAGNOSTIC AND ASSESSMENT TOOLS

#### Canine Cognitive Dysfunction Rating (CCDR) Scale

Our group developed and validated the CCDR – a 10-item questionnaire about an older dog's behavioural changes. It is an accurate and sensitive clinical assessment tool that when combined with a veterinary check up can definitively diagnose CCD. #### **Canine Sand Maze (CSM)**

Our group also developed and validated this 3-hour of a pet dog's spatial memory.




It is sensitive to age-related decline

#### PROOF OF CONCEPT

#### 1. Skin-Derived Neural Precursor Cells (SKNs)

Our group has developed a reliable method for growing a pure sample of neural stem-like cells from a small biopsy of adult canine skin.

#### 2. Engraft Extensively in the Brain


8 weeks after transplantation, these cells engraft extensively into the hippocampus (memory centre) of the rat. The red cell (below) is a donor SKN cell that has developed elaborate dendrites. The inset box shows these have dense synaptic spines, and live cell testing confirmed this cell was neuronally functionally active.

#### 3. and Rescue Memory Deficits in Old Rats

Old rats are particularly impaired at recognising positional changes in their environment. Transplantation of 200,000 SKN donor cells into the hippocampus reverses these deficits, raising performance back to young animal levels.

#### THE PLAN

We are recruiting aged pet dogs with CCD who are otherwise fit for minimally-invasive brain surgery. We will grow SKN cells from a skin sample of the same animal, and then transplant these cells into the dog's hippocampus using MRI guidance. Overall, our expectation is that the treatment is safe and the dog's CCD symptoms and spatial memory will improve.


Getting to see some dogs at last!
