Holding and delivering

This is another issue that can be a problem in gundog training.

The only reason that dogs drop game is because they haven't been trained to hold. Once your dog gets in the habit of dropping dummies, it will always be a problem.

I often see dogs in the park drop the ball at their owner's feet and look up at the owner as if to say "quick, throw it again". This is an enjoyable game to them.

So when I'm training my pup to hold, the process starts with sitting the dog on a bench or tailgate of my car, showing him a dummy and asking him to "hold".

The height puts the dog at your level which gives more control over the situation.

As soon as he holds, I say "give" and take the dummy, then praise. It's important that you take the dummy within a second of giving it to him.

Continue this process for a week or two and then let him hold it for a couple of seconds until he is comfortable "holding and giving".

Don't forget to make a fuss of your dog when you're having success.

Once he knows how to "hold and give", walk him on a lead at heel, and while walking put the dummy in his mouth and

say "hold", keep walking for a few metres then bend down and take the dummy while walking, say "give" then praise.

This needs to happen once a day for two weeks.

Now you have taught your dog that the dummy goes back in your hand once released.

Now for the last part of the exercise.

You're walking your dog at heel on the lead and you give him the dummy, tell him to "hold" then ask him to "sit", you walk around in front of him slowly and say "give", then praise. He has now been taught to deliver to hand.

A word of warning though: when dogs are retrieving out of water it's natural for them to shake the water out of their coat when leaving the water's edge, so when you're teaching water retrieving, put your gumboots on and stand at the edge of the water and as the dog nears you, put your hand out quickly and say "give", then praise.

After a dozen or so retrieves, slowly move back on land, so that your dog learns not to shake his coat until the dummy is in your hand. If by chance he drops it, gently and quickly put it back in his mouth and say "hold", "give" and most importantly, don't forget the praise, our way of communicating with our dogs.

I am particularly proud of our Scent Work Team who are doing very well with several obtaining

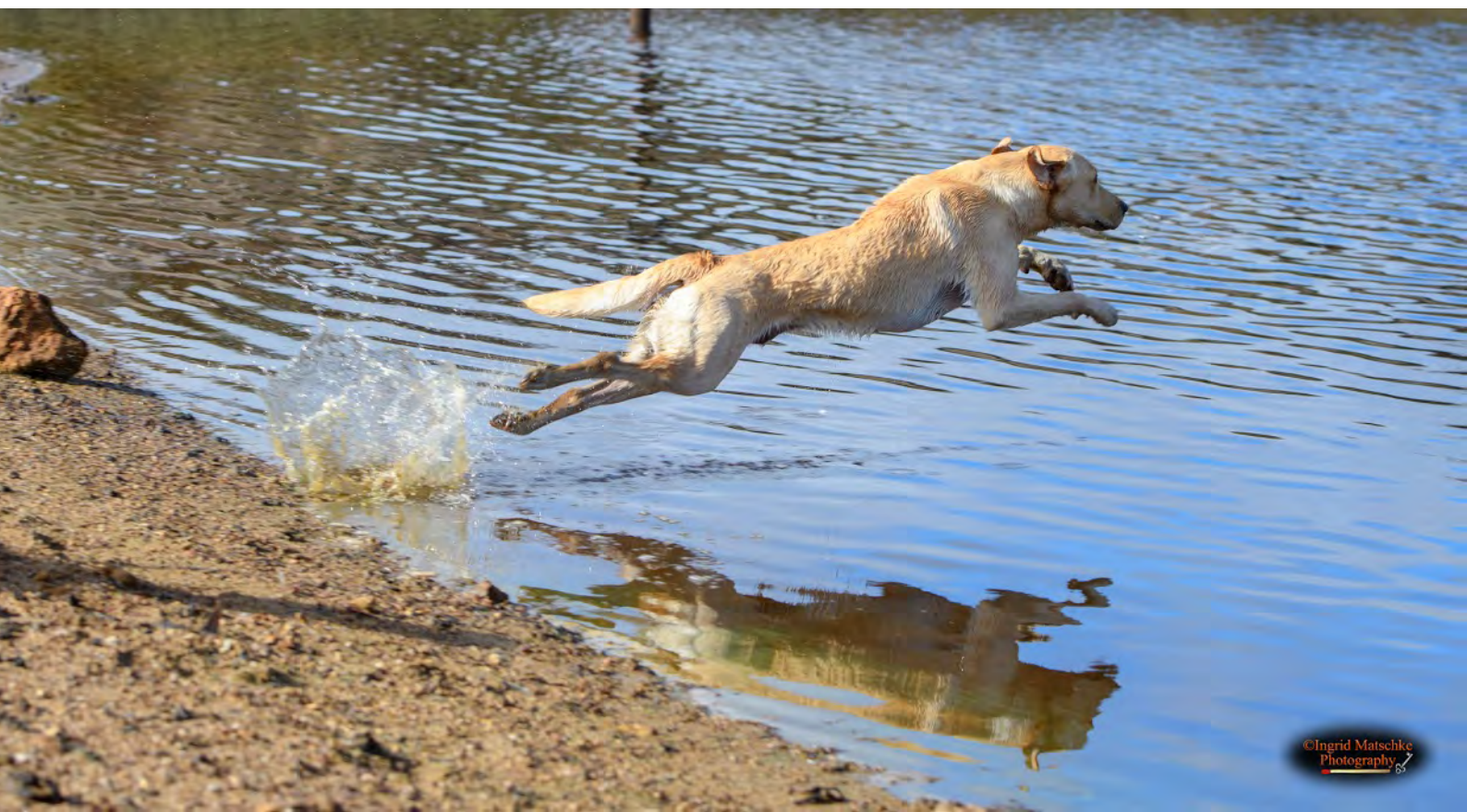
titles during the year.

The Rally course is set out with numbered stations including a start and finish.

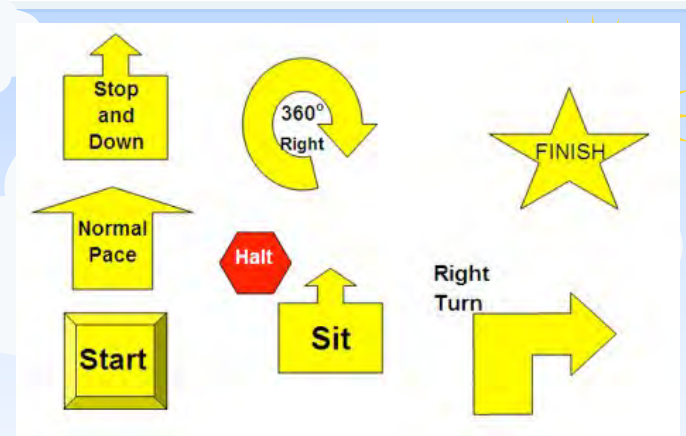

2023 Obedience Report

5th of December 2023

The Obedience part of the club still experiences a steady influx of new members especially in puppy/beginners' classes. We have 288 persons/couples/families members in obedience/Scent Work as at 27/11/2023. That is a significant increase in numbers from last year. We had 53 emails enquiring about training. Every Monday night there are approximately 30-40 persons training a dog in each of the 2 sessions.

We held puppy socialisation classes again in January and February to fill the gap until Obedience classes recommenced in March. These again proved very popular with many members from the higher grades coming out to train as well. We would have a minimum of three groups every Monday night.

We also introduced Summer Rally over the same time period with 9 dogs and handlers participating. Karen Moralee and Carmel Nottle both instructed Karen newbies and beginners and Carmel those more advanced Rally triallers.

Our higher grades 4&5 have been very well attended again this year. Our grade 5 class now is very large and we need more instructors to assist with the big class. We had a few of those interested in trialling doing the ring training with Karen Moralee.

Congratulations go to Karen Moralee who passed her Open Obedience Judges exam earlier this year and Carmel Nottle who passed her Scent Work Judges exam.

Richard ran our show handler classes for those needing assistance in the show ring. These classes still prove to be very popular through the year when weather was fair.

The club ran a double Obedience Trial Restricted to Gundogs in August this year. The club was very lucky to have our trial sponsored by Purina Pro Plan. Numbers we had 20 dogs per trial which we were happy with.

Our judges were Ros Kumela and Lynne Stapylton for UDX, UD and David Oppermann and Karen Moralee both club life members judging Open, CD and CCD.

The club also conducted 2 Introduction to Scent Work Courses with myself and Richard instructing. The first was in November 2022 where we had 13 participants. The second in August and we had 10 participants. In March we also ran some workshops for those trialling in Scent Work. We ran 6 workshops with Carmel Nottle the instructor. Scent Work is still very popular with all clubs running courses having full participation. Trials are also getting great numbers with some having to ballot.

Very happy to report that several of our scent work members have had success in the trials with a few gaining titles as well.

We ran a Mock Novice Scent Work Trial in February open to all breeds. This was a great learning opportunity for us in running a scent work trial. We had 25 entries over both the Interior and Vehicle searches. Our trainee judges at the time were Carmel Nottle and Helen Davis.

We also ran 2 Scent Work Trials. One restricted to Gundogs with a retrieving theme in April with 2 elements offered Interior and Vehicle. We offered these elements to Novice, Advanced and Excellent levels. We had 36 entries.

The second was a single element trial Novice Interior which was open to all breeds in

September. We had 33 entries with a fantastic pass rate having 20 qualifiers.

A huge thank you to Carmel Nottle for helping to organise our scent work trials this year. Carmel's help and experience was invaluable and much appreciated.

Kym and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the instructors for their continued dedication and support in 2023. They volunteer their time Monday nights for the community in the best interests of the dogs and handlers. Dorothy who continues looks after the desk taking new registrations and collar and lead purchases.

We would also like to thank those who volunteered to steward at our trails. We cannot run them without you.

PREREQUISITES FOR EARLY RETRIEVER TRAINING

One of the main attributes that distinguish retrievers from other breeds of dogs showing strong hunt and pursuit characteristics is the retriever's ability to retrieve game with a soft and gentle mouth. This is an extremely important attribute to a hunter of game birds that must be retrieved in a condition fit for the table.

Soft mouth is fundamentally a breed characteristic that needs to be maintained and bred on and therefore given careful attention in any breeding programme of retrievers. It would also therefore be wise to look for good mouth habits in the parents of any retriever pup you may seek to buy. From an early age some pups will show a natural instinct to want to carry objects around with a soft and tidy mouth and this is often a good sign. That having been said, young pups will often bite down hard on a bird and then grow out of that tendency when raised properly and learn not to consider game as their food. Early retriever training is therefore usually best introduced on training dummies with only an occasional opportunity to

experience retrieving fur and feather.

It is questionable if an inherently hard-mouthed dog can be changed into a soft-mouthed dog with training. Certainly, steps can be taken to avoid mouth problems developing and it is wise to avoid any rough tug-o-war type games when playing with a young dog. From an early age a pup should be encouraged to bring objects it finds to you and be rewarded with much praise when it responds in a correct manner.

Retrievers love the thrill of the chase and will happily chase after objects that are cast for them.



Young retrievers can also love to be the one who is being chased, and this aspect of play is to be avoided and discouraged. A young dog must learn early that it is not part of retrieving for it to run off with a dummy and we simply don't play that sort of game! The "Come" or "Here" command is a very important part of a young dog's early training and by using praise and reward a correct response should be taught and maintained both on and off lead and be reliably established before formal retrieving training commences.

The "Fetch", "Hold" and "Give" commands need to be taught with the dog responding to these commands with a firm but soft mouth. The trainers own demeanour while teaching these commands needs to be firm, patient and consistent with short and frequent sessions producing the best results. Inexperienced trainers often overdo the use of force in attempts to hasten the process but this usually has an adverse effect and only slows progress. Excessive force can also result in other faults such as the dog adopting a stand off position at the point of delivery and even freezing on the bird. The use of food as a reward motivation during this process is not usually recommended, as its presence seems to only encourage the dog

to spit out the dummy in its anticipation of receiving a treat. Only when the correct responses are well established can food be offered as a final reward.

Once these basic fetch, hold and give responses are routine then it will be time to combine fetching, carrying and delivering the dummy with other basic obedience exercises of heeling, sitting, staying and coming. When these basic skills are in place a dog is ready to be introduced to the excitement of retrieving sighted articles that will be cast and retrieved. The retrieve will now become the reward for properly executing all the basic commands and food rewards can be reduced and eventually omitted. From now on the dog should only be released on command to retrieve when the retrieve is being carried out in conjunction with excellent line manners and steadiness.

Finally, once these basic training behaviours have become routine, there will be a whole new and exciting world of retrieving opening up for you and your dog.

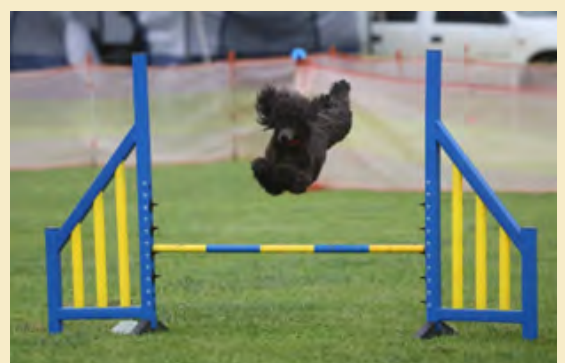
